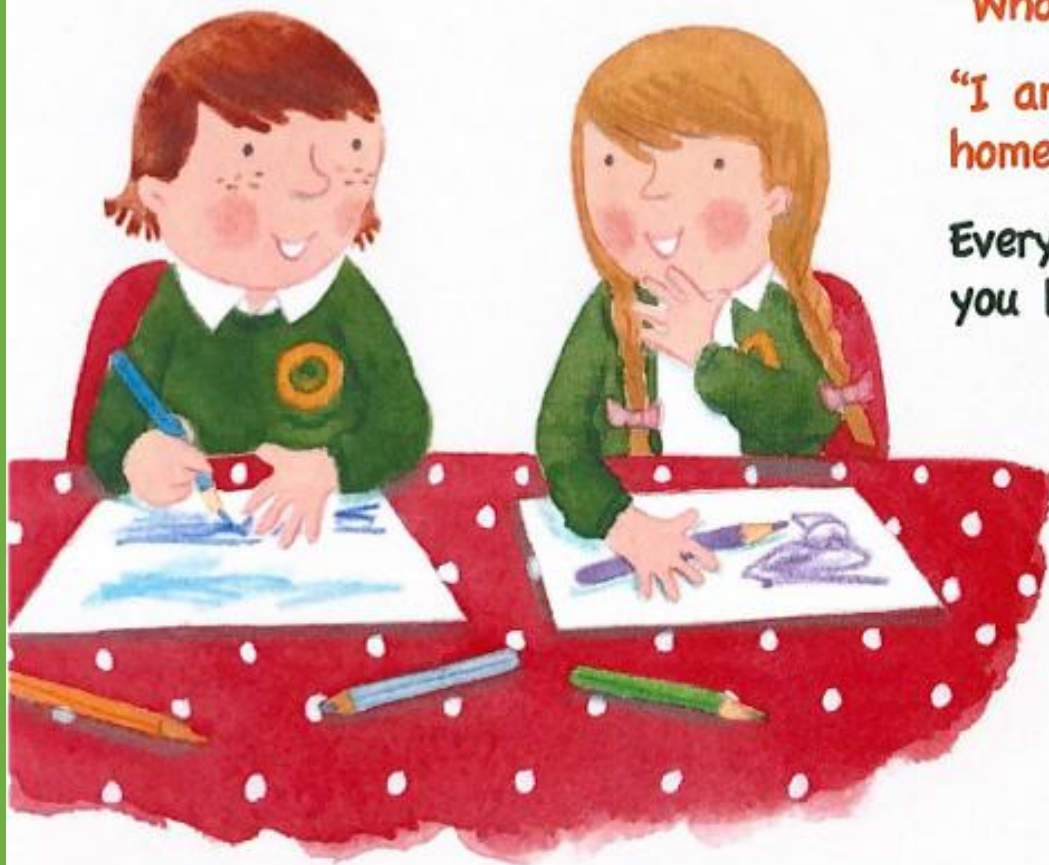
- painting, drawing and craft work

What is your favourite food?

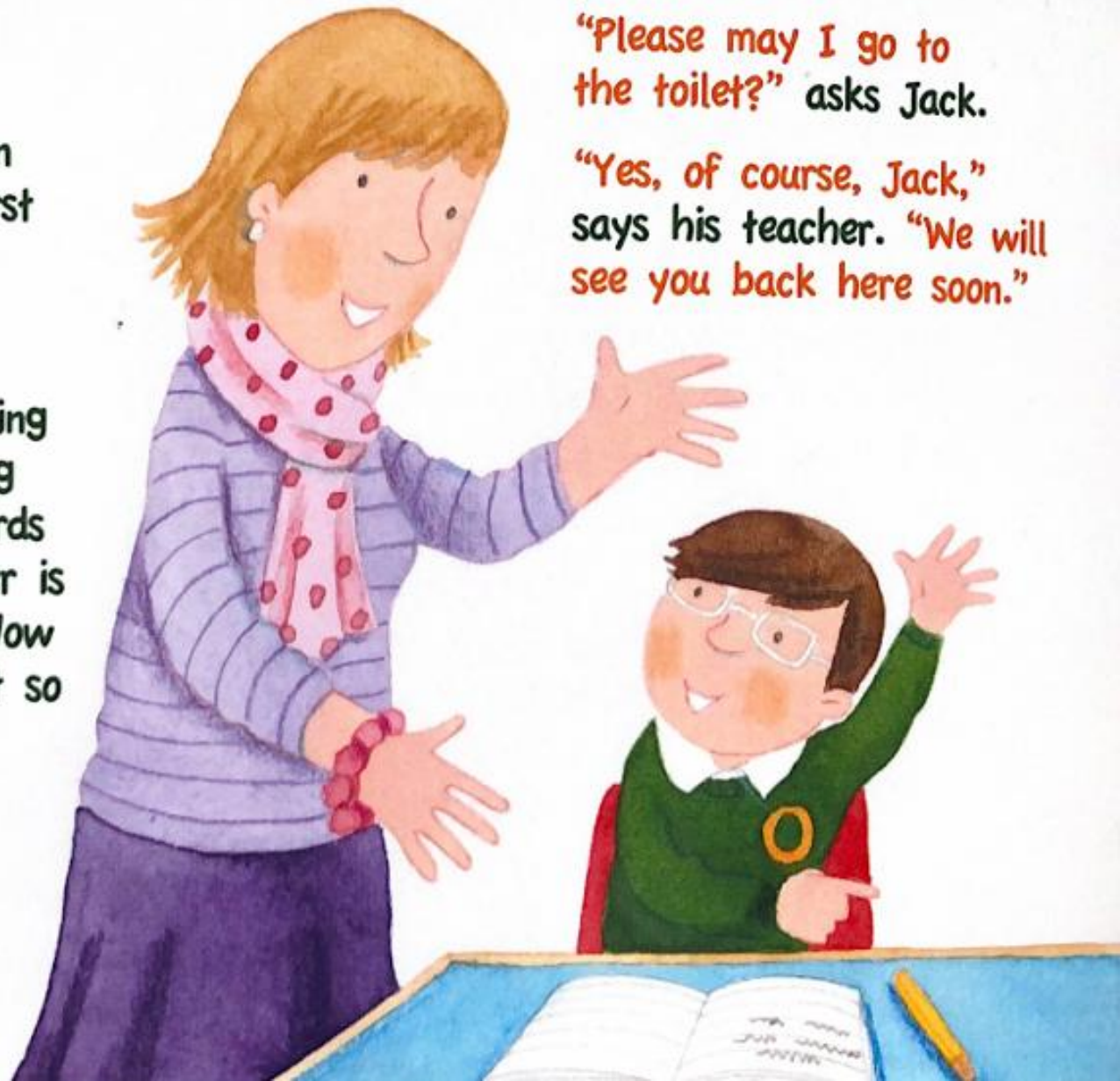
What happens if I need the toilet?
